Introduction

Welcome to the fall 2013 edition of the Mt. Hood Community College (MHCC) Fact Book. Last year MHCC proudly provided quality instruction to 28,989 students. An enrollment milestone was reached in fall 2011 when the one millionth student enrolled in courses at MHCC. (See page 25 for data showing comparative enrollment.)

The Fact Book represents a snapshot in time, presented whenever possible in charts, graphs and tables for easy interpretation. It is helpful to know that:

- > Data are based on enrollment figures from the fourth week of fall term for the past five years.
- > Data from the fourth week of fall term differs from data from the end of fall term. The latter includes a relatively higher number of non-credit and continuing education students. Relevant data are stored in a single location to assure consistency in the analysis and reporting.
- > When comparisons are made over time, the most recent data (fourth week) are compared to data from the previous four years making it possible to identify trends.

MHCC looks forward to the college's 48th year of helping students to transform their lives and direct their destinies, while maintaining our commitment to teaching and learning, resource development and community engagement.






The Mt. Hood Community College district encompasses an area of about 950 square miles with a population of more than 319,000. The district boundaries extend as far east as the lofty peak of Mt. Hood and to the Wasco County line, south into Clackamas County including the communities of Boring and Damascus and west into the city limits of Portland. The Columbia River from 33rd St. to Cascade Locks is the northern boundary. Included within this area are the high school districts of Centennial, Corbett, David Douglas, Gresham-Barlow, Oregon Trail, Parkrose, and Reynolds.
















Enrollment Patterns - 5-Year Fall Enrollment





Full-Time/Part-Time Enrollment



Credit Load Distribution




Enrollment by Day/Time/Weekend

Regions of Attendance





ANNUAL ENROLLMENT PATTERNS










Statewide Annual Unduplicated Headcount and FTE





Statewide Average and MHCC Tuition Rates by Year








